Resolution Addresses Production Needs

Topeka, Kan. - Yesterday a resolution, "urging the United States Secretary of Agriculture to permit the use of land in the conservation reserve enhancement program (CREP) for agriculture purposes such as planting of agricultural commodities including, but not limited to, grains, cellulosic or biomass materials, alfalfa, grasses, legumes or other cover crops, unanimously passed the Kansas House of Representatives. The resolution passed the Kansas Senate last week.

Allowing CREP land to be used for agriculture may benefit the Kansas economy and help farmers and ranchers with additional production opportunities. Kansas Cattlemen's Association appreciates the steps taken by the Senate and House Agriculture to address the needs of producers.
